**Format** of the database is SPSS, the file is called: ICVS2005\_3.sav

The data in key-findings have been computed using:

**-national** data-

identification variable **I005b**, in combination with weighting variable **W005b**

**-main city** data-

Identification variable **I004a**, in combination with weighting variable **W004a**

These weighing variables are based on individual respondents, not every survey was provided with household weights, but these weights are added to the database in case they were available.

- On the CD are the SPSS syntax that were used to generate most of the tables and graphs in the latest key-report (van Dijk, van Kesteren, Smit, 2008).
- On the CD is a working paper version of the key report in PDF.
