Summary	The objective of the course is to address psychoanalytic therapy research issues with the belief that sharing findings, methods, and questions about empirical research supports the development of clinical skills and critical thinking for both researchers and clinicians. The empirical implications derived from a stance that advocates for a pluralistic and interdisciplinary dialogue between psychoanalysis, related disciplines, and psychotherapy process research involve an attempt to bridging the gap between a hermeneutic and a scientific position. The search for a pluralistic perspective would probably be the best path, based on the understanding that the chasm between clinical phenomena and the requisites of empirical science cannot be spanned through a single approach. The course will explore these issues using examples from multimodal research in psychoanalytic therapy.
