1. Introduction


- ESC Working Group: International collaboration
- Aim of the study: **Identify, using different keywords, all current projects that focus on the impact of COVID-19 on different areas of criminology**

2. Method

- **Search engine:** Google
- 4 **keywords** + related terms: Research – Project – Criminology – COVID-19
- **Languages:** English, French, Spanish, Portuguese, German
- **Time period:** February 1st 2020 – August 30th 2021 (*daterange*)
- **Inclusion criteria:**
 1. Must contain the keywords;
 2. Must reflect the keywords;
 3. Institution to which the author is attached must be legitimate;
 4. Must be in the first 5 pages displayed by Google.



(total: 68)





Distribution of languages of ongoing projects about the impact of COVID-19 on different areas of criminology




