Please provide a 700-word (max) description of the topic and of each panelist; the title of the panel and titles of the individual papers; and for each participant the name, email address, institutional affiliation/status as an independent scholar, and a brief statement (no more than 100 words) about the person's work as well as any relevant publications, presentations, or projects-in-progress
